Here is a simple self-assessment to help you decide ...

- 1. Are you passionate about mobile apps?
- 2. Do you love to solve problems with visual design and making things work seamlessly?
- 3. Are you able to translate creative vision into programming code?
- 4. Can you stay focused on challenges until they are solved?
- 5. Do you have a natural attention for detail and catching software or technology glitches and bugs?



If your answer is YES to all the preceding questions then a career as a Mobile App Developer may be for you.







If you only answered YES to some of the questions but remain curious and want to know more about the program...





Continue reading to learn if you meet the *eligibility criteria* and it is possible for you to commit to the *program's timelines and admission requirements.*





Ready to learn about the eligibility criteria?

It's presented in two parts...





- Part 1 Eligibility Criteria (Status)
 - 1. Women over 16 years of age.
 - 2. Canadian Citizens or Ontario residents with a valid PR Card
 - 3. Women in the low income category (family/individual)
 - 4. Ready to work (reliable child care, housing, personal supports in place)
 - 5. Financial provisions for supporting 4 months of intensive training without working
 - 6. Able to provide original copies of residency status, income tax and academic records



- Part 2 Eligibility Criteria (Skills/Commitment)
 - 1. Proficiency in Java and/or C++ (test at intake)
 - 2. IT technical background or similar skills/knowledge background transferable from another career
 - 3. Use of a personal laptop with capability to download large software programs (ideally no more than 3 years old)
 - 4. Able to carry laptop to training site daily (no overnight storage)
 - 5. Willing and able to commit to a 24 week full-time program running from April 6 to Sept 18, 2020 / Monday to Friday / 9:30am to 4:00pm
 - 6. Able to maintain impeccable attendance and plan necessary appointments around the training schedule



Eligibility OK?

Then find out what the program offers...





- This is a *full-time, intensive* skills training program to prepare women for positions as iOS & Android Mobile Applications Developers.
- The program includes Salesforce training and certification as a Scrum Master.



- 2.8% unemployment rate for women in the ICT sector in 2018 compared to 5.9% of women in the overall the Canadian economy






A few more promising facts for Mobile App Developers

- Applicants we will need to provide proof of status to reside and work in Ontario
- Copies of total family income
- Academic records (as needed)


